



The PTT Division has decided that in Factor 40 events in relation to the team competition should be amended to allow more teams:

Consequently, 2.4.4.6 reads:

The maximum number of teams per country with all players from the same country is **2** per event. Where events are combined due to low entries in a class and the combination gives one country more than two teams in the combined event, the Organizing Committee is to inform that country that only **2 teams** per event are allowed and their entry for that event is to be revised to conform to that regulation.

2.4.4.7 reads:

Players from different countries can form a team in the team event, **but if there are 1 or 3 players in the same event from the same country, a team can be formed by these players provided that only the 3rd lowest ranked player forms a team with a player from another country.**

2.4.4.8 reads:

The maximum number of players per country in one class is **4**.

The host country's maximum number of players is 6 per class.

Ranking issues: there are some issues to assist your planning leading up to the 2012 London Paralympic Games:

- 4.1 the selection date for the Paralympic Games will be 1 January 2012
- 4.2 the ranking list of 1 January 2012 will be the one used for the selection process
- 4.3 the basis for the ranking list of 1 January 2012 is that it will include the points accumulated in 2011 *plus* the points from the regional championships held in 2011 *plus* 50% of the points from the 2010 PTT World Championships *plus* 25% of the points from the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games
- 4.4 please note that the tournament credit system will still apply to the selection process for the 2012 London Paralympic Games and details will be announced soon after the 2010 PTT World Championships

Registered Testing Pool: in order for the PTT Division to comply with the World Anti-Doping Code and the ITTF Anti-Doping Code, a registered testing pool has to be established. The players in the attached list have been selected randomly from the ranking list to be part of the RTP. If any player is already in the national testing pool established by the national association (or perhaps the NPC) they should contact Alison Burchell (burchell@ittf.com) to ensure that no duplication occurs. All players will need to register through the WADA website <http://www.wada-ama.org/> for the ADAMS whereabouts information process. This means that at all times, you need to ensure that your exact whereabouts are up to date as you will be tested out of competition at any time. If you are not at the place identified at the time indicated, the Doping Control Officer will need to report a “missed test”. Should you need any assistance, please contact your National Anti-Doping Organisation in the first instance.
