## Notes of meeting of the Table Tennis Participating nations/territories at the Fespic Games in Busan, Korea on 31 October in the Chef de Mission's Meeting Room at 19:30

- 1. Mr. LEE in his capacity as Fespic Representative to ITTC chaired the meeting.
- 2. He welcomed members to the meeting and briefly reported some progress of table tennis since he was elected in Osaka in June, 2001.
- 3. Mr. CHIANG in his capacity as the Technical Delegate to the Busan Table
  Tennis competition asked members' opinions. He explained that the group for
  singles had been made to be more than 3, as players would then have more
  matches to gain ranking points; the delay of sending out startlists was mainly due
  to the last minute entry from East Timor and some other previous Soviet nations
  as well as the problems of the central computer system; the other drawback being
  that the INAS-FID players were not checked with their eligibility and documents.
  He promised to make improvements in these areas in future games. A total of
  147 players from 20 nations/territories competed in the Games. He also informed
  members that Mr. Steven LEE, the referee had indicated to compile an
  organization manual for use of future events and asked China, Korea, Chinese
  Taipei for their national manual, if any, for reference.
- 4. Mr. LEE asked organizers of the coming events to make some progress reports.
- 4.1 Malaysia would organize a seminar for table tennis umpires and classifiers between 17-22 December, 2002 in Kuala Lumpur. Ms Cindy Leung and Dr. Aart Kruimer had consented to be lecturers and examination would be conducted. Mr. CHAN of Malaysia told the meeting that Mr. Nico VERSPEELT, the Secretary of the Medical Committee of ITTC had asked for USD50 per participant to be offered to Aart. Mr. CHIANG promised to

find out the story. Recruitments would be opened to Fespic region and also to others outside the region should there be places left.

- 4.2 Ms MINOWA told members that the Japan Open for INAS-FID players would be held on 17-18 May, 2002 and Mr. Steven LEE had agreed to be the TD. At present they were asking for higher sanction factor from ITTC.
- 4.3 Mr. JAI of China, through the interpreter, gave an account of the Regional Championships to be held in Shanghai between 17-23 September,2003. He circulated an information sheet to members. The entry fee per team member would be USD736, including capitation tax of USD36 plus daily charge of USD100 per day. The first entry form would be sent on 15 March while final entry in early August.

As TD of the regional Championships Mr. CHIANG added that, as class champions would be qualified direct to the 2004 Athens Paralympics, doping test would have to be done.

Members also agreed that, even INAS-FID players might not be accepted to the 2004 Athens Paralympics, all Class 11 players would still be admitted to the Shanghai Regional Championships.

5. Mr. LEE then explained the reasons for forming the Fespic Table Tennis
Committee, with Mr. CHIANG gave further information as the ITTC Treasurer.

Members all agreed that there being an urgency to form the committee. He went on to explain the membership of the Committee and their roles and duties. After some deliberations the following members were confirmed:-

A contact list of all Committee members was collected and Mr. LEE would be circulated to members later.

6. As Fespic Executive Committee member Mr. CHIANG informed members that a Task Force had been formed as to coordinate all the sports programmes, competitions, seminars/workshops, NPC development for the next 4-6 years, with the purpose of developing our own technical and classification expertise, to help in the 2006 Kuala Lumpur Fespic Games and the Beijing Paralympic Games in 2008. A copy of Task Group paper which was submitted to the Fespic Assembly and adopted would be circulated to members of the Table Tennis

Committee.

- 7. Nations/Territories were asked to open their annual Table Tennis competitions to other nations/territories, and to apply for factor 10 sanction from ITTC. Players would have more events to gain ranking points, in particular for novice players.
- 8. The meeting adjourned at 21:30
