I. Accommodation

The accommodation was in hotel National (**** level). The entrance, reception desk and all other needed premises of hotel, were accessible for the wheelchairs. The doors to rooms are more than 75cm and the bathrooms' door are 70 cm without door.

In the hotel are four big lifts and enough number of the next special needed rooms for the participants of Championships.

The breakfasts and dinners were served in the hotel in very good quality. The very simple lunches, vere served, for the participants, directly in Sport Venue.

II. Venue

For the 2^{nd} Parapanamerican TT Championships we used the Venue in Associacao Atletica Banco do Brasil (AABB).

For the tournament we used two sport halls there, side by side. One of them for the competition tables (8 + 8). The fields for all of the tables were according with the IPTTC Rules. In the second hall, we had the 10 practising tables.

The Organizers together with the Club rebuilt some of areas of the club, to be quite accessible for wheelchairs too (for ex. bathrooms, toilets a.s.o). They used the chemical toilet too.

The floor in the halls wooden, good

Lighting - more than 1 000 Lux, no daylight there

Seating for spectators – there were about 200 seats in the main hall for the spectators

(mainly school children) and walking participants of

the Championships. Wheelchair's spectators had their places

directly on the floor of playing field.

Referee table – was directly in the hall+ table for computers too

Playing and practice facilities - there were 16 competition tables in main hall and 10 practising tables in the second one.

Gluing room - the open stand before the main hall

Officials rooms - OC room, TD and IPTTC room, first aid, Classification room a.s.o.
