#### **Accommodation**:

Accommodation of the participants of CP-ISRA World Championships 2005 were in the big campus of the Connecticut College in New London.

There were accommodated all of the participants of the Games. The delegations were accommodated in the different houses of the Campus. Therefore Table tennis tournament had three men wheelchairs players only, we hadnt some problem with the accessibility of the Accommodation. Therefore the rooms were in student's college, its were only very simple furnished, without AC, refrigerator or some TV set (but with internet connection there!).

The breakfast and dinner were in different dining rooms, but in a good

For lunch we had daily some sendwich, soft drink, cookies and some fruits, in the special tent or dirrectly in the Venue.

### **Transport**:

The transport were organized from the three airports: NY JFK, Crafford and Boston by buses.

For the local transport Organizers used shuttles, but it was a pity, they didnt were going regularly around the whole areal of the College and therefore wheelchairs and some of the standing players had problem with the transport. The Venue wasn't too far afied, but was there big difference in elevation.

#### Venue:

The name of our sport hall was **Luce Field House**. The hall is a part of the very big campus of Connecticut College in New London, but on the other

site of the highway than the accommodation part and under a hill.

The hall was very big and fit for our competition. We used there 4 playing tables and 5 warm up tables.

Floor: the special lino, good for the table tennis

Lighting: very good, sure approximately 1000 Lux without

daylight.

Spectator seats: approximately 200 seats for the spectators were there Referee's table: in the middle of the shorter side of playing part of hall

Gluing room: out of the vestibule.

Next rooms: we used there only one office room for the TT OC and

all of other officials, no some next one.

**Competition days**: July 2<sup>nd</sup>: arrival day

July 3rd: classification, 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, draw of Open, practise

July 4<sup>th</sup>: 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting + the next draws, Open singles, start of Teams
July 5<sup>th</sup>: Teams + start of wheelchair men and women standing singles

+ Official open ceremony of the Games

July  $6^{th}$ : Teams + start of Single in classes of standing men

July 7<sup>th</sup>: Single in classes + all of medal ceremonies July 8<sup>th</sup>: Possible departure day for TT participants

**Meetings**: OC organized two meetings with the managers of the delegations.

The first one was in July 3<sup>rd</sup> at 13:00 o´clock with the draw of Open. The second one was in July 4<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 with the draw of Teams and

Single in classes.

<u>Participants</u>: 10 countries together 25 players and 11 official staff

(21 men + 4 women)

**Education programs**: no education programme was organized during the tournament

<u>Classifications</u>: Three classifiers, Aart Kruimer NED

20 athletes were classified, 17 male and 3 female. They have been classified on the issue of eligibility (cerebral pulsy), the CP class and the TT class.

The change of class concerned 6 athletes.

The Organizers prepared all needed condictions for the classification well only no some fresh water or some small refreshment for the classifiers were

there.

**Results**: The whole time of our competition, main OC of Games promised only

to send us the computerman, but never they sent him. Christian and Rong

Lillieroos had to prepare alone all of our needed documents

for the tournament, including the Results in the Book Form for the

delegations and officials.

The Results in Book Form were prepared for the delegation in July 7<sup>th</sup> in

evening.

#### **Evaluation:**

Therefore the TT tournament was only one small part of the big multisports Games, it is now a little difficult to evaluate it, nevertheless I will try speak about TT tournament of CP-ISRA Championships in New London:

- 1. I cannot inspect the accommodation of all of our participants, therefore they staied with their multisports delegation in the differents part of Campus. I could speak with people from the different countries only and they appraised accommodation approvingly like very simple, not in normal level of IPTTC tournaments, but possible. The biggest problem for all of them (ecpecially for wheelchairs), were bathrooms and toilets. In the houses were always only common one for the rooms from one big corridor. But all of them liked the friendly environment in the college.
- 2. The Venue was excellent for our competition and organizers including the volunteers tried to prepare the best condiction for the tournament. Therefore we had only very small number of the players and used four competition tables only, organisers made nice marching and introduction of players and umpires before every round of the tournament.
- 3. Of course, we had some problems here, incompatible with the level of Fa 30:
  - a) players didn't get the player ID numbers and therefore sometimes was the indentification of them difficult
  - b) we had only two official umpires for 4 competition tables. The deputy referefee Ray Cavicchio and the assistant Coordinator Field of play Keith Evans, had to help them all-time.
  - c) during the competition we had not computerman for the leading of the tournament by computer and for the preparation of the Book form of Results.
  - d) normally, during the IPTTC tournaments, the Organizers have to give the Daily allowance for the officials during the first day of the competition.
    - Here, we had to ask for it several times, but we get it in the last day of the competition, when the tournament was quite over only.
  - e) Except of the breakfast, lunch and dinner, wasn't there some possibility to buy some soft drink, coffee or small snack.
